# From Pastor Jeff

"All these people were still living by faith when they died. They did not receive the things promised; they only saw them and welcomed them from a distance, admitting that they were foreigners and strangers on earth." (Hebrews 11:1) They were longing for a better country—a heavenly one. Therefore God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared a city for them.

So, last month, I was sitting at my desk in the middle of the morning having a snack. I pulled out a candy bar from my desk. It was labeled a "Fun size" Snickers. It was one of the most disappointing experiences of my life. The bar (I use the term loosely, it was more a wafer) was disappointing on several levels. It was small, it was 30% smaller than the wrapper, and it was miniscule compared to the original fun-sized bars of 20 years ago. It was the opposite of "fun."

Staring at that pathetic bit of chocolate, the pervasive ugliness, mendacity, and all-consuming, grasping, avariciousness of modern society struck me. Selling small things in big packages (I'm looking at you Girl Scouts!) to fool the consumer is common. Politicians lie, know that we know they are lying, lie anyway, and we elect them because they lie to us. Corporations lie continually in advertising. It's gotten to the point you can almost be assured that whatever benefits are touted on the packaging are the very things the product will fail to do. Sitting there at my desk, a sense of sorrow and frustration washed through me far greater than my frustration with the M&M Mars Corporation.

Then this part of a hymn came to mind:

"Fading is the worldling's pleasure, All his boasted pomp and show; Solid joys and lasting treasure None but Zion's children know."

Disappointment with human civilization is inevitable. We humans apart from God are irretrievably corrupt, selfish, and lost. All we build or participate in is tainted with our corruption. As the poet and priest Gerard Manley Hopkins described it, "all is seared with trade; bleared, smeared with toil; and wears man's smudge and shares man's smell."

But God does not leave his world to our whims. The cheaters and hucksters and con men don't have the last word. The violent and rapacious, the cruel and predatory, they don't win. Jesus has promised to return and set all things right. He came once as a baby in a manger, he will come again as a glorious King, a rider on a white horse whose name is Faithful and True. With justice he will judge and wage war. (Rev 19:11). We are waiting for a better country and a city not made by human hands (Heb 11:10, 16). So don't let the sordidness of this world steal your joy. Remember this Christmas that this world has been overcome (John 16:33) and the Babe of Bethlehem is now the Lion of the Tribe of Judah and he is coming to establish his Kingdom without rival.

#### THE CHARACTERS OF CHRISTMAS

December Sunday school lessons teach children about the characters who were involved in the birth of Jesus. We are all familiar with the characters of Christmas. What an unlikely roster of players God selected to be in the Christmas story, but with each character, God eliminates excuse after excuse for not being part of Jesus' story today. Sunday school lessons this month look at some of the characters that were involved in Jesus' birth and how they reacted to it.

Elementary Sunday school class lessons focus on:

The Wise Men: We will focus on the example they set for us in seeking Jesus with all that they had in order to worship Him fully.

The Distracted Innkeeper: We will discuss some of the distractions that can get in the way of focusing on Jesus as we celebrate Christmas. We will provide some practical ways to "make room" for Jesus this Christmas.

The Religious Leaders: Children will learn about the Religious Leaders who were too busy being pious to notice that Jesus had been born. We will talk about the difference between having a head full of knowledge and a heart full of knowledge during the Christmas season.

Herod, the Opposing Ruler: children will learn how God protected Jesus even though King Herod worked hard to kill Him. Herod represents those who are against God and Jesus during Christmas.

The Shepherds: We will learn about the Shepherds and the excitement and joy that filled them upon hearing the good news of Jesus' birth. They let this excitement change their plans, their hearts, and their action as they chose to share the Good News.

Preschool classes will study an age-appropriate version of the same lessons.

Wise Men: Children will learn about the importance of seeking Jesus and praising Him for coming to earth to save us!

The Distracted Innkeeper: We will learn about the innkeeper. We will discuss some of the distractions that can get in the way of focusing on Jesus as we celebrate Christmas.

The Religious Leaders: Children will learn about the Religious Leaders who were too busy to notice that Jesus had been born.

The Shepherds: We learn about the Shepherds and the joy that filled them upon hearing news of Jesus' birth. They let this excitement change their plans, their hearts, and their actions. They also made the choice to share this Good News

God chose special people to be part of this great event, and their reactions to it show how we also need to respond to God's will in our lives. Christmas is not only a time for passively remembering an old story. It is also a time for rejoicing and a time for action. It's a time to examine our lives and see if Jesus' birth changes how we act.

This actually is what the special ops group did in the beginning, and it is a fantastic way to share the love and message of Jesus. This ministry puts young folks in a role of reaching out and listening to some amazing people who can feel neglected and lonely especially at Christmas time. When the weather gets worse, we will likely alternate the homeless ministry and the assisted living ministry. If you have any small gift items or things you think the folks in assisted living may enjoy, I would love to bring them down with us to give out.

The youth will be enjoying special Christmas themed games and our annual Christmas party on Wednesday, December 20. If you would like to bring some of your Christmas treats for us that would be very much appreciated. There are many opportunities to help with youth activities, and I would like to invite you to come and support any or all of the youth events. 





