

From Pastor Jeff

What a change this winter has been from last year! The snow around my house is melting fast. I took the dog down to Ski Beach this morning and noticed that the bushes along the creek are covered in buds. It maybe freezing in the mornings, but the trees know that Spring is right around the corner. They look dead but they are ready to burst to life. Seeing these buds got me thinking about the power of Christ. You see, new life is what Jesus is all about. He said so himself in John 10:10 "I have come that they may have life and have it abundantly."



Now as I was thinking about these words and the life waiting to spring up all around, I realized my thinking was wrong. The funny thing is that we hear Jesus' words and think of Spring and think that is the kind of life Jesus is talking about. Somehow we are dormant like that plant and then Jesus brings out the new leaves. But this is not actually a good analogy. You see the trees and bushes at Ski Beach will go dormant next winter and then next spring will leaf out again. It's all part of the life cycle of the natural world. The life Jesus brings is on an entirely different order than this. It is better pictured as if you see a tree carved out of gray stone. It's a fairly lifelike statue but obviously a statue. Then suddenly the gray trunk begins to turn brown, the stark stiff branches turn lithe and supple, and the hard, rocky leaves begin to turn green and soften

and rustle in the breeze. In seconds, where there once stood a lifeless stone statue, now a living, growing tree stretches its branches to the sky.

Jesus did not come to make us better people, to reform our fallen natures, to improve our lifestyles, or make us nice. He came to make us new creations, to give us life, true life, eternal life. As we proceed into Lent and look forward to Resurrection Sunday, ask yourself, am I the same old-same old, or am I something new? Ask Jesus to make you new and settle for nothing less.



Saying Farewell in Belize ...

As I pray over and plan our final mission trip to Belize, it is with a sad heart. The great friendships that have been formed with Pastor Jim and his wife Anna and the locals we have served like Mr. Benny and little E.J., will be greatly missed. Watching the light come into this village over the years has been a privilege and an honor that God would let me glimpse him moving on the earth.





On Feb 19th, a fire tore through a tenement building right behind the church. The fourteen families living there lost everything. Thankfully, changes in the

village have been happening in the last few years and the community has stepped up to help support



these families. With the example of Jim and Anna ministering to them and teaching them to support and care for each other, the village stepped up with temporary housing and food. This sense of community is new and I feel it's a direct result of Pastor Jim and Anna.

The easiest way for the Mensies to expand their reach in the village is through the children. Imagine a single Sunday school classroom with up to thirty five children, all eager to learn, but with ages from three to


fourteen. How do you effectively teach them all?



What I would like to do is to raise \$4,000 of construction money to pay for a second Sunday school room that we can help complete before the rainy season in June. We also have room for two more team members with construction skills. This person would assist this year's team which includes a remodel expert. With the addition of another two people, the team would be able to do many of the projects currently urgently needed.

I know this is a BIG request, but the goal won't be met if I don't ask. God is performing miracles in Seine Bight and I know he can make this happen through the combined efforts of The Village Church and several others. I ask that your prayers would cover the village of Seine Bight, Pastor Jim and Anna and the whole team as we prepare to serve. Thank you!

MISSION COMMITTEE REPORT



InterVarsity Christian Fellowship Campus Ministry

InterVarsity Christian Fellowship (IVCF) is a university campus ministry committed to establishing and advancing witnessing communities of students and faculty who follow Jesus as Savior and Lord: growing in love for God, God's Word, God's people of every ethnicity and culture, and God's purposes in the world. IVCF staffs minister in a variety of ways including planting chapters that reach every corner of campus, sending students to global mission fields, serving the larger Christian Church through retreat and training centers, and producing award-winning books and video resources. IVCF's goal is to draw students to

Jesus as Savior and Lord, and to teach students to respond to God's Word. During the fall semester at UNR, seven students made decisions to follow Jesus! This month, Taylor, a UNR student who leads Bible Studies for the sororities on campus, attended a national IVCF Greek Conference in LA. Katelyn, a student that Taylor took with her, made a decision to follow Jesus!

For a number of years, The Village Church has supported the Northern Nevada IVCF ministry team (Ken Bridwell and Mallory Morgan) on the UNR, TMCC and SNC (now SNU) campuses. Mallory currently serves as the Team Leader assisted by Kaitlin, an intern. Ken is the Area Resource Leader for UNR, UC Davis and Sacramento. The team reports that the UNR campus chapter has 30 seniors, the largest they've ever had. Mentoring these students for the transition beyond their undergraduate education is a key focus of IVCF's ministry this semester.

In January, Ken, Mallory and Kaitlyn attended InterVarsity's tri-annual national staff conference in Orlando, Florida. As an organization, IVCF asked what it means to long for revival on the college campuses. After a day of prayer and fasting during the conference, it seemed very clear that God was about to do something new on campuses throughout the United States (and beyond). Mallory wrote that she has sensed this in different ways at UNR over the past nine months. The Reno team noticed Jesus' wineskin parable being mentioned repeatedly and reports this last semester has felt like a stretching of new wineskins in many ways. Mallory believes that God is about to pour out new wine this year in various, powerful ways on the UNR campus and develop IVCF opportunities at SNU and TMCC as well. Mallory is now working with Lukas at Cornerstone Church in Incline where a new college ministry has just started.

On Thursday, April 2nd, IVCF is hosting a "Reason to Believe" presentation by Dr. Hugh Ross, a respected Astrophysicist, and a panel of other scientists at UNR on the integration of science and faith. Members of the community are welcome to attend. Over 160 attended a program that this group presented last semester.

Also for those living in Reno, there are two Saturdays scheduled for IVCF students to "Work-A-Day" in the community to complete projects you may request them to do. What they earn will go toward their IVCF Spring Break Retreat expenses. The suggested donation is \$13.00 per student per hr. If you are interested, please email Mallory at mallory.morgan@intervarsity.org and include your contact information, address, the number of students you'd like and the preferred day you would like them to come.

Please continue to pray for these campus ministers, the students whom they serve, and for God's powerful movement on university campuses in Nevada and across the US.



YOUTH MINISTRY NEWS



We have some fun events on the calendar to look forward to with the youth like camp, mission trips and a couple day trips just for fun. We are starting a new series in the youth group for March called, "Doubt it". We were all designed to ask questions. As toddlers, we constantly asked, "why?" But as we get older, asking too many questions is often discouraged - especially when those questions are about our faith. In this fourweek series, we'll talk about how having questions (and even doubts) about God might not be as scary or as shameful as we thought because we are not alone with our questions. God doesn't shame us when we have questions. Our questions don't always get answered and we need to learn to turn to Godly people who can help us with our questions.

Camps and mission trips are the places where youth get a chance to grow in their faith and have an amazingly fun time doing it. In the past, we have seen youth moved in powerful ways by the Holy Spirit on these trips and the impact can last a lifetime. On mission trips, this happens along with impacting the lives of others. The proceeds of the chili cook-off last month went to help support our trips but if you are interested in supporting or coming along on any of these events, please contact me or the church office.

- Our Upper Room Youth Group meets Wednesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the upstairs youth room. This group is open to all 6-12th grade youth.
- On Thursdays there is a youth Bible study that meets at Starbucks from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Sundays we have an outreach to the homeless and elderly called Special Ops. This group travels to Reno to help folks living on the streets with prayer and we hand out supplies that will keep them more comfortable outdoors. Sometimes we visit senior centers to spend time with residents. We leave the church at noon and return by 3:00 p.m.



MUSIC IN WORSHIP

As a way of reminding us all of why we have music in worship and how The Village Church approaches our worship music, here is an attempt at explaining. At The Village Church, we take prayerful care in selecting the music shared during worship. Although singing is not worship itself, it is a way we speak to our living God. As a praise team, we try to be mindful that we are there to lead, encourage and enable folks to praise through music. It is not a performance – it is a tangible exaltation and exclamation of God's awesome glory and power. We are blessed in this body to have two different ways to praise Him through music. The songs sung during our 8:00 a.m. service are strictly old hymns of the faith. The 10:00 a.m. service music is the sharing of newer songs. This has been a successful structure for our worship community.

When choosing new songs for the praise team to share, we are careful that the message and lyrics are Biblically sound and we try to rearrange most songs to minimize unnecessary repetition. Prayerfully working with Pastor Jeff, we try to reflect and support his sermon and scripture readings through the song selection.

Singing to our God has been around since the earliest gatherings of people to worship. Singing is a vital part of how we do church together, shoulder to shoulder and soul to soul. We are blessed to be able to serve this body of believers through music, standing beside you. We hope and pray that you, in turn, are blessed through lifting your voices to our Lord and Savior.


