From Pastor Jeff

Well, after 31 weeks we finally have come to the end of The Story. From Creation to the New Creation we have gone on a journey through God's Story in the Bible. We've met a diverse cast of characters, and gotten a taste for the grand sweep of God's plan of redemption in Jesus Christ. We learned a lot, but there is a lot that got left out. I want to encourage you to not give up reading the Bible for yourself. Now that you have a sense of the sweep of the narrative, go back and do more in depth study of the individual books. We barely scratched the surface of the Wisdom books like Proverbs and Ecclesiastes. The prophetic books contain powerful testimonies of God's saving judgement and redeeming love. Paul's letters are worthy of serious study and thought.

Some tools that can help you in your deeper study of God's Story are a good study bible, like the ESV Study Bible (2008, Crossway), and a Bible dictionary, like the IVP New Bible Dictionary, edited by I. Howard Marshall (1996, InterVarsity Press). There are helpful websites like the Biblegateway.com, that let you search across multiple versions, and read different translations of the Bible in English. We live in a time of great abundance of resources to make sense of God's word, but they are all useless if we are not reading the Word for ourselves.

So at the end of the Story, don't give up, keep reading and learning. God's word has great treasures for those who seek them!

LAST OUTDOOR WORSHIP


Sunday, September 2nd



Back To School!

It sure seems like Summer went by faster than usual, but the last couple months were amazing as well as short. In July our youth went to San Francisco and spent six days doing all dif-



ferent types of outreach and service ministry with YWAM. This was our 6th year going on this trip, and we made a difference in people's lives. Everyone who attended this mission trip were impacted by God. Also, in July I took some youth to Wild Island water park in Sparks for a goodbye to Summer day on waterslides. We had some younger folks join in and even a few other church folks. It was a very fun day and I found that I am especially gifted at being stuffed into small tubes full of water and screaming at young people in 100-degree weather.

Our first youth group of the 2018/2019 school year was on August 29 and had over 20 kids! The Upper Room Group is for all middle and high school youth to enjoy. We meet in the youth room on Wednesdays from 6-8pm and follow the Washoe county school schedule. That means when there isn't school, we aren't meeting, but if there is school we are. We will be starting up some Bible study groups this fall and they will be an excellent way to go deeper in your faith and Gods word, so be watching for specific days/ times on those groups. On Sundays, the youth will continue to visit homeless and senior citizens in Reno with our group called "Special Ops", which meets Sundays from 12-3pm.

I would like to invite any of you adults to come and help out or hang out with us at any of our youth groups. My vision is for our whole church to be involved with the youth and help raise them up to be men and women of faith. It might sound scary, but it is very rewarding. In the Gospel accounts, Jesus acknowledged the great value of children. In a culture that tended to ignore and otherwise devalue children, Jesus made it clear that he viewed children as people with great value in God's sight. Jesus reached out to children, welcoming them into his presence and blessing them (Matthew 19:14–15). On several occasions Jesus went out of his way to heal

children (Luke 8:49–56). He was willing to be "bothered" in order to minister to children.

Five love languages

CORNER

How can we reach out with Jesus' love to bless the children in our homes, neighborhoods, churches and communities? Love is like a language—it must be spoken (expressed) and understood (received). Learning how a child perceives and receives love is essential for those who seek to bless children with Jesus' love. Not every child speaks the same love language. In *The Five Love Languages of Children*, Gary Chapman and Ross Campbell identify five love languages for children: appropriate physical touch, words of affirmation, gifts, acts of service and quality time. The book explains how an adult (such as a parent) may liberally extend love to a child using one love language, only to find that the child does not feel loved because he or she does not "speak" that particular language.

Perhaps a child's dominant, or preferred love language is appropriate physical touch, but the parents, though liberal in gift giving, are physically distant with the child, and as a result he or she feels unloved. We have to figure out how a child receives love and then reach out using that love language. One of the ways the authors give to discern a child's dominant love language is to observe how the child expresses love to others.

When working with a group of children, we will need to speak love in multiple love languages. While spending extended, quality time with them we'll offer words and actions that convey this vital message: "we care about you—you are accepted and loved by us." We can provide the children with snacks (the love language of gift giving). At times we can involve them in service projects (the love language of acts of service). We also can extend careful and appropriate physical affection (the language of physical touch), such as a pat on the back or shoulder or an appropriate, non-sexual hug. In various ways, using multiple love languages, each child can receive the blessing of Christ's love extended from a safe, caring and supportive adult.

Of course, such Christian love has to be given unconditionally. If the only time children receive attention and affirmation is when they have done something to please us, they quickly learn that our love is conditional, based on their performance. In *The Gift of the Blessing*, Gary Smalley and John Trent point out that affirmations should be given to a child based on who the child is (a valuable and worthwhile person whom Jesus accepts and loves) rather than on what they have done, or not done. It is particularly important not to withhold our blessing when a child's performance is disappointing. In this way we model God's unconditional grace and love that is in Christ.




