

From Pastor Jeff

Christmas time is an amazing time of year. A time of wonder, a time for joy, peace, and goodwill to all. Well...at least it's supposed to be like that. If you're anything like me, though, Christmas is more likely to be a time of stress, of unreasonable expectations, of lists and need



to's and have to's. One trip to Wal-Mart or Target this time of year can evaporate an awful lot of "goodwill toward men." Holiday travel, crowded stores, crowded kitchens, grumpy kids (or parents), in-laws and outlaws, all can seem to wage a better war on Christmas than anything the media can gin up. Joy is not the first thing that comes to mind - which is sad, really.

Think about it: The One through whom the galaxies were made emptied himself and came down and became an embryo, the awesome majesty of God bound into the frame of a helpless infant. The One who knows every star, every grain of sand, every drop of water intimately, doesn't know how to talk or even walk. The uncreated One who needs nothing, now needs to be fed and changed. The Mighty God, Lord of Hosts, El Shaddai, is now found in the weakness of a baby boy, born to poor parents, in a backward time, in the backwater of an oppressed nation on the edge of the Roman Imperium. All because he loves us, his sinful, rebellious, unlovely creations. Loves us more than we can ever imagine.

The prophet Isaiah named him "Immanuel," 700 years before he was born; the angel tells his foster father, he is to be called Jesus, "because he will save his

people from their sins"; the herald angels the night of his birth call him "Savior." *Jesus* means "Yahweh saves"; *Immanuel* means "God with Us"; and *Savior*, "the one who saves."

God-given names in the Bible represent the essential character of the one named. Jesus' names reveal that he came to save sinners, people like you and like me. The One who has every right to condemn and judge us, instead came to rescue us and redeem us. Jesus himself says, "I did not come to judge the world, but to save it." (John 12:47) and "the Son of Man came to seek and to save what was lost. (Luke 19:10) and that he came "to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45)

So this Christmas time, ponder the Babe in the Manger, and realize that you are loved with a fierce, unshakable, audacious, stop-at-nothing kind of love. God came from heaven to earth to save your life, to be your Savior. Believe this and Christmas really will become an amazing time of year.





World Relief Organization

World Relief is a global Christian humanitarian organization that brings sustainable solutions to the world's greatest problems – disasters, extreme poverty, violence, oppression, and mass displacement. It partners with local churches and community leaders in the U.S. and abroad to bring hope, healing and transformation to the most vulnerable.

For over 75 years, across 100 countries, World Relief (WR) has been connecting people to the world's greatest needs—extending compassion to millions of suffering men, women



and children -- creating change that lasts—today, tomorrow and for generations to come. It partners with over 6,000 churches and 95,000 local volunteers joining together to be the hands and feet of Jesus, bringing light to the darkest corners of our world as a powerful force for good.

In the 1940s the War Relief Commission was founded to address urgent humanitarian needs in war-torn Europe with the motto: "Food for the body and food for the soul". In the 1950s the War Relief Commission changed its name to <u>World Relief</u> and launched an aid program in post-war Korea. In 2015 World Relief celebrated 35 years of refugee resettlement in the United States having welcomed over 250 thousand refugees from more than 80 countries.

In 2020 despite the global pandemic, World Relief served more people (4,192,738), empowered more churches (4,265) to bring wholeness and healing to their communities, and trained more volunteers (67,000) around the world than it did the year before. For example:

Sudan: World Relief has five main offices and sub-offices in Sudan serving the vulnerable with humanitarian and disaster response aid; more than 3 million people remain displaced within the country.

DR Congo: World Relief's large-scale agriculture and food security response serves returnees in DR Congo and provides seeds, tools and training on agriculture techniques.

Afghanistan refugees: World Relief helps by providing apartments and assistance for Afghan American ally refugees to resettle in the US and sponsors resettlement immigration groups to help with integrating into society.

Our church Missions Committee supports this ministry and urges our congregation to keep such Christ-centered humanitarian efforts in our prayers.




