

Happy New Year! No, this greeting is not a month early. December 1st marks the beginning of Advent this year. The Christian year begins with the first Sunday in Advent, So, Happy New Year! Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas and goes until Christmas day. It is a season of preparation meant to help us make space in our lives for the miracle of Christmas, the coming of God in the person of Jesus. In fact, from the start, Advent was a time to prepare for the second coming of Christ as we meditate on his first coming, recalling his birth in the manger at Bethlehem, his ministry of teaching and miracles throughout Galilee and Jerusalem, and especially his death and Resurrection for our salvation. This year, to help me get into the spirit of Advent, I will be reading a chapter a day from the Gospel of Luke. There are 24 chapters in Luke's gospel and there are 24 days in Advent. Reading a chapter a day means I will get to live through Jesus's whole earthly life and ministry as I get ready for Christmas. What better way to start the new (Christian) year and focus on the reason for the season! Won't you join me in this journey through the gospel?

We will be celebrating our Lord's Supper during worship on Sunday, December 1st. Each Sun-





Join Pastor Jeff for a study based on his sermon series. This is a great opportunity for learning more about God's Word and to fellowship together.


Women's Bible Study -Thursdays at 9:30 a.m.

ADVENT IS COMING! Beginning Sunday, December 1st

What is Advent? The season of Advent lasts for four Sundays leading up to Christmas. Advent is a time of expectation and hope. The word "Advent" means "arrival" or "coming." During the season of Advent we stop and take a moment each day in December to

remember why Jesus came at Christmas and the true meaning of why we celebrate Christmas.

Advent symbolizes the present situation of the church in

these "last days" as God's people wait for the return of Christ in glory to consummate his eternal kingdom. The church is in a similar situation to Israel at the end of the Old Testament: in exile, waiting and hoping in prayerful expectation for the coming of the Messiah.

Israel looked back to God's past gracious actions on their behalf in leading them out of Egypt in the Exodus, and on this basis, they called for God once again to act for them. In the same way, the church, during Advent, looks back upon Christ's coming in celebration while at the same time looking forward in eager anticipation to the coming of Christ's kingdom when he returns for his people. The Advent Wreath and Candles: The Advent wreath is made from evergreens, symbolizing everlasting life in the midst of winter and death. The circle reminds us of God's unending love and the eternal life He makes possible. Advent candles are often nestled in the evergreen wreath. Additional decorations, like holly and berries, are sometimes added. Their red color points ahead to Jesus' sacrifice and death. Pinecones can symbolize the new life that Jesus brings through His resurrection.

The most common Advent candle tradition, however, involves four candles. A new candle is lit on each of the four Sundays before Christmas. Each candle represents something different, although traditions vary. The four candles traditionally represent faith, hope, love, and joy. Often, the first, second, and fourth candles are purple; the third candle is rose-colored.

Occasionally, a fifth white candle is placed in the middle and is lit on Christmas Day to celebrate Jesus' birth.

YOUTH NEWS

Merry Christmas! When you think of Christmas, you probably think about an event – an event that is (hopefully) filled with gifts, food, family and fun. But what happens when that event isn't as joyful or peaceful as we wish it were? And is the "event" even what Christmas is about anyway? This month the Upper Room Group will be doing a four week series looking at what this season is truly about. It's about getting ready to receive God's gift of Jesus, sharing that gift with others, rejoicing in the surprising gifts God gives us and taking time to enjoy God's presence. The youth will hopefully experience all of those things in our church and its ministries, as well as through the series we are studying.

The youth will again be helping with the food box ministry by packing boxes and also visiting folks in Reno on Sunday afternoons to give out warm sleeping bags and other items that will help them. Also, we will continue to meet at Starbucks for a Bible study from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

If you would like to help with any of our youth programs or our homeless outreach by purchasing sleeping bags, sleeping pads, or socks, or even by coming along with us, I would encourage you to do so. Find me any Sunday for more details, and thank you!

Upper Room Group meets Wednesdays from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. in the Youth Room. Bible study meets at Starbucks from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Special ops outreach leaves the church at 12:00 p.m. and returns by 3:00 p.m. on Sundays.

MISSONS COMMITTEE REPORT: YOUTHCOMPASS



YouthCompass seeks to address the unique needs of mobile international High School and Middle School students by providing caring adult role models who assist them in navigating life. YouthCompass was founded in London in 2001 by expatriates from business, government and nonprofit sectors spanning multiple continents. They recognized the unique needs of Third Culture Kids and wanted to help meet that need. There are currently about 650 Englishspeaking international schools and the intent of YouthCompass is to connect with students in each of the schools.

The YouthCompass leaders walk with students, entering their world and loving them unconditionally – modeling respect, trust and friendship. These values reflect their commitment to Jesus Christ. A leader becomes a true friend in the midst of cultural transition, coming alongside those that are often challenged with the difficult questions of adolescence in a cross-cultural and mobile environment.

YouthCompass is committed to challenging international teens to give of themselves to those less fortunate. Through their annual *PROJECT COMPASSION*, students have the chance to give something of themselves to people who may never be able to repay them. Project Compassion is

a week-long service project which gives international students an opportunity to serve those living in difficult conditions. In 2019, students from around the world boarded buses in central Europe for Romania. These youth

brought water to three homes, fenced a community garden and helped renovate a youth camp.

Tim Gilbert has volunteered for YouthCompass mission trips for the past eleven years to help with Project Compassion, often with others from our church. In Romania, Project Compassion brought thirty Third Culture kids to the project in 2019. Of these, about half were unchurched. Tim was one of the construction site leaders that brought running water to two houses for three families. A pastor speaks to the kids every evening. During the week, staff and volunteers have incredible conversations with students and the depth of community built during that week is amazing. Year after year, they see transformed lives, and students are anxious to return and bring their friends. Tim has seen some Youth-Compass kids returning as young leaders on later trips.

Tim is planning to go on a short-term mission trip with Project Compassion again April 10-18, 2020. Several of our Village Church youth are planning to join him and others from are church are encouraged to go and serve as well. As in the past, it promises to be a very rewarding experience.

Our church mission budget provides support for the YouthCompass organization and also helps fund our congre-



gation members' participation in Project Compassion. Individuals can also donate through The Village Church to help provide funds for this trip.

CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES



Children love Christmas! They love the gifts, lights, trees, and treats. Sadly, many children in our world today have no idea that Christmas is when we celebrate Jesus' birth. There are many children who have never heard the nativity story, or they may not understand or have been told the significance of who Jesus really is. He is the Savior who came as a baby to take away the sin of the world so we can be with God forever.



In Sunday school this December, we will be learning about the incarnation of Christ from a lesson series called "Jesus: God who came to Earth". The series covers the Christmas story and significant events from Jesus life to emphasize truths about the incarnation. In a culture that prefers to portray Jesus as merely a cute baby in a manger, it is important to clarify the truth that Jesus' virgin conception and birth in Bethlehem isn't the beginning of the Son of God. It is the mysterious and miraculous moment when the eternal Son entered physically

into our world and became one of us. The children's

sermon in the sanctuary this month will focus on the Advent theme that week (Faith, Hope, Love, Joy) and then the candles will be lit before children are dismissed to Sunday School. Once they're upstairs, we will be diving a little deeper into what Advent is and what the candles and liturgy means.

As we go through the all too familiar traditions of the holiday season, please remember that the little children in your life and

community need to be told

the true meaning of the season. As you pause to reflect, wonder, and give praise and gratitude to God for the saving love of Jesus Christ this Advent season, please also take a moment to consider how you would explain all of that to a child – simply and meaningfully, and then pray for opportunities to share the love of Christ this season in both words and deeds to a child of any age.



COOKIE EXCHANGE SING-ALONG NIGHT DECEMBER 21ST


On the night of our Sing-
