Happy New Year! Welcome to 2020! Every pastor I know is doing a sermon this Sunday with some kind of pun on the number of the year. It's an illness we pastors have, the need to pun in our sermons. My sermon is titled "2020 Vision." I couldn't help myself. I'm going to be preaching through the book of Proverbs for the next couple of months and since Proverbs shows us how to live correctly, I was thinking about it like a pair of glasses helping us see clearly. Proverbs gives us 20/20 vision, spiritually speaking. Proverbs is one of the Wisdom books of the Bible, along with Job, Psalms, Ecclesiastes, and the Song of Songs. It is a book compiled by several editors containing collections of proverbs and poetic discourses. King Solomon collected the initial core and wrote many of the individual proverbs, but there are collections from non-Israelites



and unknown teachers. Proverbs is given for the purpose of showing us what life looks like lived in the "fear of the Lord." It shows us what righteousness looks like and how to avoid folly. Wisdom is more than knowledge or intelligence. It is life lived skillfully; it is knowledge correctly applied. Join me this year in studying Proverbs and learning how to live a life pleasing to our Lord. We will be looking at Proverbs in the sermon on Sunday mornings and at the Pastor's Bible Study on Wednesday night at 6:00 pm in the Fireside Room.






The Deacons have provided food to our community for over thirty five years. We are always in



God is so amazing! I love how He calls us to leave behind the things of our past and cling to a new life and identity in Christ, the one who gives us endless love and eternal life.

In 2019 the youth had many truly powerful experiences. In July, a group of us went on a week long mission trip to Oakland California with Youthworks. We traveled with a group that drove from Minnesota and spent the week helping out in many community programs that included work with seniors, farm programs, the elderly, and community events. We also sent a group of young girls to Calvin Crest camp where we had an amazing week getting to know God in a beautiful setting outside of Oakhurst California.

In the youth group gatherings there were too many fun games to count and big concepts were taught with powerful truths from the Growth curriculum. "Growth" is a program we started using in fall of 2019. The lessons are easy for the youth to understand and will hopefully continue to have a big impact on them as they work out their faith.

I am looking forward to trying some new ideas for 2020 to get more youth in the community participating with the church programs and activities and we will start planning our 2020 summer camps and mission trips very soon as well.

Our Youth group called "The Upper Room Group" meets on Wednesdays in the upstairs youth room from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. All 6^{th} through 12^{th} grade youth are welcome.

There is a youth Bible study that meets Thursdays from 4:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m. at Starbucks coffee. The church will buy anyone that shows up a cup of hot chocolate or coffee. 6th through –12th grade youth are welcome.

On Sundays, Special Ops travels to the Reno area to distribute items that will help the homeless or needy. We hand out sleeping bags, hygiene products, socks etc. The group leaves the church by noon, and returns by 3:00 p.m. 6th through 12th grade youth are welcome. MISSION NEWS

THE NELSONS SERVING WITH SERGE IN GUATEMALA

Dear friends,

It's a beautiful day in Guatemala City: sunny, 74 degrees, and with thunderstorms sure to come later this afternoon. I'm sitting in the infirmary at our kids' school where I pinch hit for the school nurse from time to time, grateful for the chance to hang out with our girls during their day and appreciate the fact that such a sweet school exists to serve the many missionary families that call Guatemala home. Everybody is in school this year - Hazel started preK in August, along with Lucie in 3rd grade and Cora in 5th, giving us five blissful days a week of childcare from 8-3.

Accordingly, we've gotten pretty busy during that time. Jeff has gotten involved in several projects that seem sort of unwieldy but are all interconnected. The main thing he has been working on is opening up a clinic to provide therapy to ministry workers of all stripes. He's also been giving talks on mental health to a few different groups. In August he helped with a panel discussion/Q&A at Iglesia Reforma for the young adults, and fielded many questions about faith and depression/anxiety, the "rightness" of taking medications, the difficulty of finding a therapist that won't tell you that your lack of faith is the cause of your depression, and much more.

Yesterday he stood in the back of the room while we talked to our diabetic group about emotional health and listened to people express fear and despair around their diagnosis but also about the utter difficulty of being people living in extreme poverty in an unstable country, with no way out. He has been studying group interventions for depression that have been developed in similar low income countries, and is considering training options for lay mental health providers to meet needs in these types of communities.

I just counted and I've seen a grand total of 200+ patients in clinic over the last month, including our diabetes group, which has been a *hoot*. Esther (my teammate—another RN who coleads the group with me) and I have been coping with the (good?) problem of too many people turning up each week, pushing the limits of classroom

capacity and time for getting appointments done well. It has been apparent for some time that *something* needs to be done about improving diabetes care in the landfill neighborhood, and so we are planning to start a program early in 2020 that formally enrolls patients, checks labs, consistently provides medications, education, group support, and follows this chronic disease that disables and kills so many people. The hope is to lift the shroud of hopelessness and despair around this diagnosis - in a place like the US where poverty-bound people with diabetes have primary care providers, access to the \$4 list at Walmart, food stamps, and Medicaid, diabetes is not seen as a death sentence. Here, as one of our patients memorably put it yesterday, "It's like a cancer."

I think a lot about the time we have been allotted here - maybe just the next 4 years, maybe the rest of our careers - as something of a talent that God has given us to invest well. It would be easy to just keep showing up to the existing clinic and plugging away at seeing patients, doing what is essentially sub-par urgent care work, to post pictures of all that on social media and appreciate the feeling of doing a noble thing in a hard place. Much less glamorous is working on the profoundly sad and difficult intersection of poverty and chronic disease, trying to build infrastructure and program in a place that tends to destroy that sort of thing. Pray for us: for shrewdness, creativity, persistence, a good sense of humor. For the language fluency that understands implicit meaning, for real compassion and love for our patients, and for God to multiply our small lunch in a crazy way to meet the needs of a starving hillside.
