



From Pastor Jeff

There's a story about a man who, leaving church one Sunday, complained to the pastor about the music. "I didn't like the songs you chose today," he said. The pastor simply replied, "That's okay; we weren't singing them for you."

The pastor may have been too blunt, but he made a good point. In our consumeroriented world, we sometimes think church services are just for us. But we aren't spectators attending a show; we're participants in the greatest and most uplifting enterprise in the universe -- worshiping God. On Sunday morning God meets with us as we worship Him.

The late William Temple, archbishop of Canterbury, put it well in his definition of worship: "To worship is to quicken the conscience by the holiness of God, to purge the imagination by the beauty of God, to open the heart to the love of God, and to devote the will to the purpose of God."

Biblical worship, like biblical love, is primarily an act of the will before it is a feeling. So real worship takes effort and determination. We get out of a worship service what we put into it. Take time before the service to center your thoughts and pray. Pray for yourself, the congregation, the children, the Sunday School teachers, the pastor, the singers. During the service give yourself to the songs and the prayers. Pay attention to what the Holy Spirit is saying to you through the message. Be expectant. Jesus wants to meet with you.

Mission Aviation Fellowship

Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) is one of the organizations The Village Church Missions Committee supports on behalf of the congregation. After World War II, a few veteran pilots in the US and UK dreamed of a way they could use their flying skills to reach isolated people with the gospel. They founded MAF a few years later, and for more than 75 years now men and women have been using aviation to share Christ's love in the most remote places on earth. MAF is one of several mission aviation groups that support missions around the world.

There are people in remote areas of the world who, simply because of where they were born and live, will never have the chance to enjoy a life where their children can go to school, they can get medical care or help when disaster strikes, and where they can experience the love of Jesus. Geographic barriers, like jungles, mountains, and deserts, or social, political, or religious barriers separate millions of people around the world from things we in the developed world take for granted. Therefore, MAF's vision is to see isolated people changed by the love of Christ.

MAF/US operates a fleet of 39 airplanes and serves in 12 countries around the world, including four restricted-access countries. Last year, MAF flew over 6 million pounds of cargo and 52,686 passengers. Here is an example of a MAF mission from last November: two MAF aircraft touched down in the remote village of Long Punjungan in the heart of Borneo (Kalimantan, Indonesia). The MAF planes were carrying the doctors, nurses, and pastors pictured



below. In addition, the planes transported medicine and supplies for several local Indonesian churches that have partnered with MAF to serve the small Dayak Punan community of Belaka by providing medical care and addressing the spiritual needs of the community alongside the local pastor.

After the one-hour MAF flight to Long Punjungan, the team traveled by boat upriver for an additional 2 hours to finally reach Belaka. Over the following two days, the medical team treated around 200 people. The entire village was presented with biblical teaching on the message of the gospel and given the opportunity to respond. MAF teams look forward to future trips to Belaka to continue working alongside the pastor there as he disciples the growing body of local believers.

The Missions Committee asks our congregation to pray for MAF pilots, mechanics, their families, doctors, nurses and the people they serve – for safety and fruitful ministry aimed at growing God's Kingdom through the spreading of His Good News! Passion Center was founded in 2004 as a ministry designed to reach out to orphan children in Malawi with the good news of Jesus Christ and to provide basic survival and developmental needs to them in child headed and surrogate households. Sponsors included a variety of evangelical churches, including Baptist, Evangelical Lutheran, and Bretheran. Our Mission Committee has been providing support to them over the last two years after having received a request in our suggestion box by the Mission bulletin board. (Be sure to use this new feature with your own candidates for consideration!).

Since its founding Passion Center's Ministry scope has grown dramatically to now include:

- 500 Orphans, Special Needs Children (They call them "Champs"), and vulnerable children receiving care, meals, education, medical attention and gospel education on a daily basis.
- Five Passion-connected churches planted in their own buildings with expanding community ministries.
- Establishment of an indigenous Community Health Network serving and impacting 150 villages.
- Five Adult Literacy Programs.
- 63 adults completing the final year of the school of Ministry and Missions.
- A church based Vocational Training Program started in 2022 for Masonry, Carpentry, Welding, Tailoring
- Additional self-help groups for girls, mothers, health providers, all based on gospel principles and prayer.
- A distributed Passion Center for Pastors Program (PCP) providing three year Bible training for 1400 + rural pastors throughout Malawi.

A key feature of this Christian outreach is that it is distributed rather than centralized. It goes to the villages, where the people are. For example, the orphans are placed in the villages, where an aunt, grandmother, cousin or older sibling can act as head of household and then Passion Center supplies food, school uniforms or supplies, medical support, scholarships, tutoring or other needs to promote stability and personal development for the children.

The need for support is especially acute just now as Cyclone Freddy roared throughout the region this March, killing 500, with almost a half million people displaced and 500 still missing. The cyclone has caused untold trauma, loss and hopelessness to the Nation and to Passion Center's orphans, families, churches, and to the surrounding communities they serve. Please, above all, be in prayer for Passion Center as they turn their attention to restoration and rebuilding in the wake of this disaster and continue to spread the hope that the love of Christ provides.
