From Pastor Jeff

A few years ago, on one of the first nice days of spring, I took our old dog, Ruby, for a walk. I walked from our house to my office, about a mile. There was only one major street we had to cross, a busy country highway not unlike Hwy 28 in Incline. As we got to the corner, the light was red, so we had to wait. Ruby (the dog) looked up at me with a puzzled expression when we stopped. When Ruby went for a walk, she went! She had no desire for stopping in the middle (unless it was to chase ground squirrels). I pushed the crossing button, the light turned green, and we started across the crosswalk. As we did, a couple of big rigs rolled to a stop. I was glad they had obeyed the light! I looked at the big chrome grills on the trucks, slowing to a stop and then looked down at the dog to make sure the noise of the squealing breaks and rumbling engines hadn't upset her. Ruby was also looking at the trucks, walking with her head high, with almost a look of pride on her face (If such a thing is possible for dogs). It was like she was thinking, "That's right, you better stop for me! Big Bad Ruby is comin' through." I had pushed the button for the crosswalk, the trucks had stopped for the red light, but the dog seemed to take the credit for a safe passage across the street.

It made me wonder, "How often am I like that?" I go through life unable to see into God's realm, in many ways uncomprehending of the larger reality around me. Who knows what doors God has opened for me, what buttons he has pushed, how many safe crossings I have made because of the Lord's action? I'm tempted to take the credit for all my successes and to forget that I am only a very small person in a very big universe, surrounded by an invisible reality that is as real, in some sense, more real, than what I can see and touch, smell, and hear. Thank God for his love and mercy and grace that he puts up with such silly creatures as myself!

Wednesday, May 10th



MEMORIAL SERVICE FOR PAT COLLINS


Saturday, May 20th at 2:00 p.m.

Hello and happy spring to everyone!






